**Request for an Amendment to Ordinance 12-0105 to Allow a Dog with a Shock Collar to be Off-Leash Received:**

A communication was received from David Hill, 3408 28th Avenue South, regarding a request to amend the current dog and cat ordinance. He said Ordinance

12-0105 states that no dog or cat is allowed to run at large and must be leashed with a leash not to exceed 6 feet in length. Webster, he said, defines "at large" as "to be free from restraint: at liberty." He said today's technology has enabled dog trainers and owners to control and restrain their dogs with training collars or shock collars. He requested that shock collars be added to this ordinance as a dog with a shock collar is not free or at liberty and is under supervised control of his owner.

Police Chief Ternes stated he has not had a chance to look over Mr. Hill's request, however, he has visited with the Humane Officers and they have some concerns. He recommended that his department be given some time to research the request and come back with a recommendation.

There was consensus that this issue would be brought back in four weeks.

### **Michael Leier and Ron Hanson Reappointed to the Housing and Redevelopment Authority:**

The Board received a communication from Mayor Walaker recommending that Michael Leier and Ron Hanson be reappointed to the Housing and Redevelopment Authority.

Commissioner Mahoney moved the reappointment of Michael Leier and Ron Hanson to the Housing and Redevelopment Authority for terms ending September 30, 2010 be approved.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Mahoney, Williams, Wimmer, Coates and Walaker voted aye.

### **Ordinance Relating to Driving Without Liability Insurance Prohibited to be Brought Back in Two Weeks for City Commission Action:**

The Board received a communication from Assistant City Attorney Patricia Roscoe stating the 2007 legislature changed the state law concerning the penalty for driving a motor vehicle without a valid policy of liability insurance and she is submitting an Ordinance amending Fargo Municipal Code Section 8-0320 reflecting the 2007 legislative changes.

Ms. Roscoe stated the proposed ordinance needs some further work and she will bring it back in two weeks for City Commission action.

Commissioner Coates moved the Ordinance Relating to Driving Without Liability Insurance Prohibited be brought back in two weeks.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Coates, Williams, Mahoney, Wimmer and Walaker voted aye.

No Commissioner being absent and none voting nay, the motion was declared carried.

### **Application Filed by LeeLa Thai Cuisine, LLC d/b/a LeeLa Thai Cuisine for an Alcoholic Beverage License Approved:**

A Hearing had been set for this day and hour on the application filed by LeeLa Thai Cuisine, LLC d/b/a LeeLa Thai Cuisine for a Class "GH" Alcoholic Beverage License at 1450 25th Street South, notice of which had been duly published in the official newspaper for the City of Fargo.

No written protest or objection to the granting of the application has been received or filed in the office of the City Auditor, and said application has been approved by the Police Department as to the character of the applicant.

The Board determined that no person is present at this Hearing to protest or offer objection to the granting of the application.

Commissioner Mahoney moved the application be approved.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Mahoney, Coates, Williams, Wimmer and Walaker voted aye.

No Commissioner being absent and none voting nay, the motion was declared carried.

**Proposed Changes to the Fargo Metro Area Transit Routes Approved:**

A Hearing had been set for this day and hour to receive comments on the proposed permanent expansion changes to the Metro Area Transit routes.

The Board received a communication from Transit Planner Mike Simonson stating Fargo Transit proposes to make route changes to take effect October 13, 2007. He said the changes are primarily expansions in service on existing routes enabled by receipt of additional state aid funds. Mr. Simonson requested approval of the following route changes:

Route 15: Add a second bus from 6:45 A.M. to 6:45 P.M. to provide 30 minute service between downtown and West Acres/Wal-Mart. This would run weekdays and Saturdays.

Route 21: Add a 6:50 p.m. run to extend evening service on weekdays and Saturdays.

Route 22: Add a 7:15 p.m. run to extend evening service on weekdays and Saturdays.

Route 11: Saturday service would become half-hourly from 7:15 a.m. – 6:15 p.m.

Route 14: Saturday service would become half-hourly from 7:15 a.m. – 6:45 p.m.

And the following two very minor route alignment changes:

Route 21 would exit West Acres by the theaters on 17th Avenue South instead of 38th Street by Best Buy.

Route 22 would add a small loop to maintain better service to Village West. This would involve going south from 9th Avenue South on 42nd Street to 11th Avenue South to 40th Street to the 9th Avenue South route.

Commissioner Coates moved the route changes be approved as outlined above effective October 13, 2007.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Coates, Williams, Wimmer, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

No Commissioner being absent and none voting nay, the motion was declared carried.

**Resolution Adopting the Revised Cass County Multi-Jurisdictional, Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan:**

A Hearing had been set for this day and hour to consider formally adopting the revised Cass County Multi-Jurisdictional, Multi-Hazard Plan.

The Board received a communication from Emergency Services Coordinator Leon Schlafmann stating at their August 20, 2007 meeting, the Cass County Commissioners conducted the first public hearing on the 2007 revised Cass County Multi-Jurisdictional, Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. He said there were no public comments submitted prior to or at the meeting regarding the revised plan and no public comment has been received at the Emergency Management Office. Mr. Schlafmann submitted a resolution for adoption of the revised plan and requested it be formally adopted.

Commissioner Mahoney offered the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The City of Fargo, North Dakota, in cooperation with Cass County, North Dakota has, as required by federal regulations, developed a Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP); and

WHEREAS, Such plan is for the identification of specific hazards within the City of Fargo and is used for reference when completing federal grant applications before and after a disaster; and

WHEREAS, All future federal disaster funding will require such planning process documents; and

WHEREAS, The Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo deems it necessary and desirable that such Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, That the City of Fargo, North Dakota, a municipal corporation, does hereby formally adopt the Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That such plan be utilized in any future application for federal funds.

Second by Wimmer. On the vote being taken on the question of the adoption of the Resolution Commissioners Mahoney, Wimmer, Williams, Coates and Walaker voted aye.

No Commissioner being absent and none voting nay, the Resolution was adopted.

**Hearing on a Dangerous Building Located at 313 19th Street North: City Attorney's Office Directed to Prepare the Appropriate Findings of Fact and Order:**

A Hearing had been set for this day and hour on a dangerous building located at 313 19th Street North.

The Board received a communication from Head of Inspections Ron Strand submitting a Notice of Dangerous Building Order. He stated this hearing is the culmination of a notice he issued on July 9, 2007 which contained a deadline of August 9, 2007. He said his notice required removal of this structure because it had

been damaged to the extent of more than 50% of its value as determined by the City Assessment Department. He also submitted a photo representative of its condition.

Howard Johnson, owner of the building, stated he works every day and he does not get much time to spend on the building. He said he has a lot of valuable car parts in the building and it will take him a while to get his things out of there. He requested that he be given more time to remove his items from the building.

In answer to a question, Mr. Strand stated the Order gives him 30 days.

Commissioner Williams moved the City Attorney's Office be directed to prepare and serve the owner with the appropriate Findings of Fact and Order and the Inspections Department be authorized to solicit proposals for the removal of this structure if it is not removed within the time allowed by the Board's Order.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Williams, Coates, Mahoney, Wimmer and Walaker voted aye.

No Commissioner being absent and none voting nay, the motion was declared carried.

### **Tax Levies for the Budget Year Beginning January 1, 2008 and Ending December 31, 2008 Approved:**

The City Auditor's Office published a Notice of Hearing stating this is the time and date set for a Hearing on the 2008 Budget at which time all interested persons could appear and would be heard.

Commissioner Williams questioned the \$885,000 increase in capital improvements.

Finance Director Kent Costin stated the City has been in a growth mode and there are a number of projects that need to get done.

There was discussion regarding the revenue projections.

Mr. Costin stated staff has been extremely cautious in the revenue projections.

There was discussion regarding the budget increases.

Mr. Costin stated there has been a 7.5% increase in the overall general fund budget and energy costs are up 14%.

Mayor Walaker stated the one mill increase was not an easy decision. However, he continued, he would rather error on the cautious side. He said one mill is \$5 to \$6 on a \$100,000 home.

Commissioner Coates questioned if this budget included all of the new revenues the City will be seeing.

Mr. Costin stated it does and it also includes an increase for methane, carbon credits and electricity sales.

Commissioner Williams stated the City needs to be more diverse with funding sources and try to give more to property tax relief.

Commissioner Williams moved the budget be amended to maintain the general fund mill levy at 57.25 mills.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Williams and Coates voted aye.

Commissioners Mahoney, Wimmer and Walaker voted nay.

The motion was declared lost for the lack of a majority.

Commissioner Mahoney moved the 12-month budget beginning January 1, 2008 and ending December 31, 2008 be approved as follows:

After recess: All Commissioners present except Commissioner Wimmer. Mayor Walaker presiding.

### **Recommendation Received for a Proposed Modification to the Night Parking Ordinance for Street Maintenance:**

The Board received a Report of Action from the Traffic Technical Advisory Committee (TTAC) stating the Committee received a request from Steve Peterson, a resident in the 1400 block of 6th Avenue South, regarding Ordinance No. 8-1009 relating to the night parking restrictions. They said Mr. Peterson's letter stated the Ordinance only restricts six hours of the day, every other day for snow removal and street cleaning from November 1st to April 15th and his biggest issue with the ordinance is that his neighborhood is under these restrictions and subject to fines and there are other parts of town that are not under the same threat. They said City Engineer Mark Bittner explained that the Moorhead system divides the city into street

cleaning districts that are in effect 365 days a year which works well and the City of Fargo should look at possibly adopting a similar system. They stated Mr. Bittner said the City of Fargo system could have five different districts, with each district having two time restrictions; one from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for streets and one from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. for avenues, allowing for street sweeping and snow removal from curb to curb in these areas one day per week. They said Mr. Bittner stated this would not mean that snow plows would only operate once a week in a particular location during a snow fall event, but rather it would allow for cleaning during the event faster knowing the crews would return on the selected day for the routine cleaning. The Committee said Engineering staff felt this system would be a good one, as the districts would be completely cleaned one day per week, minimizing the impact on citizens and maximizing the time that plows and street sweepers could concentrate on the area and the current night parking restrictions in the Central Business District would remain unchanged. The Committee stated Mr. Weigel also said higher fines were discussed as was the possibility of a graduated fine system.

Mayor Walaker summarized the background on the night parking restrictions. He said studying this process is always a good idea but he hopes it is studied in some depth. He said just because one or two people want it changed does not necessarily require a change.

Mr. Weigel stated the enforcement process is the biggest problem and that is probably what is driving this whole issue.

Commissioner Mahoney moved appropriate staff be directed to work with the City Attorney to modify the current night parking ordinance language, schedule a public meeting at the October TTAC meeting and bring back proposed changes to the current Night Parking Ordinance for the City Commission in late October.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Mahoney, Coates, Williams and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

**City of Fargo Concurs with the NDDOT Memorandum of Agreement with the Hectors in Regards to the Placement of the Service Road in the Northeast Quadrant at the Intersection of 52nd Avenue South and I-29:**

The Board received a communication from Senior Engineer Jeremy Gorden submitting a letter from Local Government Engineer Dave Leftwich with the North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT), and a Memorandum of Agreement between NDDOT and Fred and Earlyne Hector. Mr. Gorden also attached the Report of Action from the Public Works Project Evaluation Committee dated July 10, 2007. He said all attachments are in reference to the location of the service road in the northeast quadrant of the intersection of 52nd Avenue South and I-29. He said NDDOT has agreed to place the location of the service road as requested by the Hectors because NDDOT wants to avoid any potential delays for the project and they prefer to work in cooperation with all land owners whose property is affected by any of their road construction projects. He stated the NDDOT does not feel that the placement of the service road delineates land use or zoning lines. He said the Memorandum of Agreement makes note of a special assessment agreement that both the City of Fargo and the Hectors will be party to in the future and staff is comfortable

an agreement will be worked out within the general concepts set forth in an existing agreement with the Hectors on the west side of I-29.

City Engineer Mark Bittner handed out information on the options that had been considered and stated option 3 was presented to the DOT and they worked with the property owners to obtain an agreement with that option; however they were not able to do that. He said the DOT has the authority to condemn the property for a quick take but they had to make a decision if they wanted to pursue that option and delay the project. Mr. Bittner said staff was not willing to do that and the question is if the City Commission wants to concur with the revised location. He said it does nothing with respect to the zoning and only deals with the location of the frontage road.

There was discussion regarding the timeline for the eminent domain process.

Mr. Bittner stated in order to keep the project on schedule, staff did not want DOT to go through the condemnation process.

There was discussion regarding other options.

Kevin Gorder, Assistant District Engineer with the NDDOT, stated the option was presented to the Hectors and they said this was not an option they would consider.

City Attorney Erik Johnson stated he is under the impression from the DOT's standpoint that they would not have time to pursue the eminent domain process.

Mr. Gorder stated the plan needs to be presented to the DOT by October 4th to get the funds for the project.

Mr. Bittner stated the DOT needs to make decisions on other projects if this one is dropped.

There was discussion regarding delaying the project and the affect that would have on funding from the DOT.

Mr. Bittner stated the other projects are contingent on the alignment being built.

Mayor Walaker stated the City Commission has already made a decision on the zoning and they are not going to support any zoning change no matter what happens with this project.

At 7:07 p.m. the Board took a five-minute recess.

After recess: All Commissioners present except Commissioner Wimmer. Mayor Walaker presiding.

Wally Storm, 4901 Meadow Creek, submitted a copy of a letter written by Mike Hamerlik asking that the City Commission remain steadfast in their previous decisions regarding appropriate commercial development of the land and to reject the NDDOT/Hector Agreement. He said he and his neighbors have been hearing there have been letters back and forth from the DOT that the frontage road cannot be located where it was proposed in option 3. He said they are requesting that the City Commission be careful on what is agreed on.

Commissioner Coates stated the City Commission can either keep going and acquire the land with eminent domain which will delay the project for a year or accept the offer.

Jordon Johnson, 46th Avenue South, asked that the City Commission stand firm on their original decision.

There was discussion regarding the timeline and what the City's priorities are.

Mr. Gorder stated the property owners were pretty firm during the DOT's negotiations with them.

Mayor Walaker stated this is a long process and there are too many things that hinge on the frontage road.

Commissioner Williams moved the agreement be rejected and instead move the 45th enhancement from 2008 to 2009.

Second by Mahoney for discussion purposes.

Mr. Bittner stated his recommendation is to accept the DOT's recommendation and move forward. He said the zoning is a separate issue. He questioned if the City Commission is prepared to lose this project in 2008.

On call of the roll Commissioner Williams voted aye.

Commissioners Mahoney, Coates and Walaker voted nay.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared lost for the lack of a majority

Commissioner Mahoney moved the City of Fargo concur with the NDDOT Memorandum of Agreement with the Hectors in regards to the placement of the service road in the northeast quadrant at the Intersection of 52nd Avenue South and I-29 but that Item A relating to 50 acres of commercial zoning be deleted.

Mayor Walaker relinquished the Chair to second the motion. (Deputy Mayor Coates presiding.)

Deputy Mayor Coates stated she is concerned with what this could do to the timeline of the project. She said what the present Commission does at this time does not control what future Commissioners do. She said she does not know if Commissioner Mahoney's motion will do anything other than jeopardize the project.

Mr. Bittner stated it is critical that the project is built next year. He said \$25 million projects are not moved overnight.

Robert Grossman, Las Vegas, Nevada, stated it is unfortunate the Hectors did revert to this tactic, however, as a partner in the development in that area he has a big concern with the frontage road. He said they have very significant timelines and not going ahead with the interchange will have a devastating impact on that entire intersection. He said the concerns that have been raised were very legitimate, however, he hopes the Commissioners will look at the big picture and what impact their decision in this regard will have on everyone.

Commissioner Mahoney moved the motion be amended to direct the DOT to attempt to strike Item A from the Memorandum of Agreement and, if the Hectors do not agree, to proceed and reaffirm the 25 acres.

Second by Walaker. On call of the roll Commissioners Mahoney, Walaker and Coates voted aye.

Commissioner Williams voted nay.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

On call of the roll on the original motion as amended Commissioners Mahoney, Walaker and Coates voted aye.

Commissioner Williams voted nay.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

Deputy Mayor Coates returned the Chair. (Mayor Walaker presiding.)

**Tax Increment Financing Policy and Application Approved:**

Mayor Walaker stated this item was delayed to allow the Finance Committee time to hold a public forum.

The Board received a communication from City Attorney Erik Johnson stating the Finance Committee approved the Policy and Application form for Tax Increment Financing projects. Mr. Johnson submitted a copy of the draft Policy and requested the Board's approval.

City Administrator Pat Zavoral summarized the policy and recommended it be approved.

Commissioner Williams moved the Tax Increment Financing Policy and Application be approved.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Williams, Coates, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

At 8:06 p.m. the Board took a five-minute recess.

After recess: All Commissioners present except Commissioner Wimmer. Mayor Walaker presiding.

**Petitions for a Proposed Initiated Ordinance Regarding Initiated Ordinances and a Vote of the Electors of the City Referred to the City Auditor:**

The Board received a communication from Randy Thorson requesting an item be placed on the September 10, 2007 City Commission agenda for the purpose of presenting signed petitions for the proposed initiated ordinance and a vote of the electors of the City. He said at that time he will request the petitions be received and filed by the Commission and that the City Auditor receive and verify the petitions prior to the September 24, 2007 meeting.

Mr. Thorson stated he has 4300 signatures and they will need to be verified and the proposed initiated ordinance be placed on the ballot at the next election.

Commissioner Williams moved the petitions be received and filed and referred to the City Auditor to validate.

Second by Coates. On call of the roll Commissioners Williams, Coates, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

**Final Adoption of an Ordinance Relating to the Prohibition of Smoking in Public Indoor Workplaces Tabled:**

Commissioner Williams moved final adoption of the Ordinance Relating to the Prohibition of Smoking in Public Indoor Workplaces be tabled.

Second by Coates.

Commissioner Williams stated there is a citizens' group that will be collecting signatures to place this issue on the ballot.

On call of the roll Commissioners Williams, Coates and Mahoney voted aye.

Mayor Walaker voted nay.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

**First Reading of an Ordinance Relating to Disposition of Ordinance Violations--Procedures:**

The Board received a communication from Assistant City Attorney Patty Roscoe submitting Ordinance amendments relating to prosecution and administration of non-criminal offenses.

Commissioner Coates moved the requirement relating to receipt of the Ordinance by the Commission one week prior to first reading be waived and that the Ordinance Amending Section 1-0306 of Article 1-03 of Chapter 1 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating to Disposition of Ordinance Violations--Procedures be placed on first reading.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Coates, Williams, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

**First Reading of an Ordinance Relating to Administrative Fees for Ordinance Violations Processed Under the Administrative Enforcement Program:**

Commissioner Coates moved the requirement relating to receipt of the Ordinance by the Commission one week prior to first reading be waived and that the Ordinance Repealing Section 1-0308 of Article 1-03 of Chapter 1 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating to Administrative Fees for Ordinance Violations Processed Under the Administrative Enforcement Program be placed on first reading.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Coates, Williams, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

**First Reading of an Ordinance Relating to Ordinances-Administrative Enforcement Program:**

Commissioner Coates moved the requirement relating to receipt of the Ordinance by the Commission one week prior to first reading be waived and that the Ordinance Repealing Article 1-04 of Chapter 1 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating to Ordinances-Administrative Enforcement Program be placed on first reading.

Second by Williams. On call of the roll Commissioners Coates, Williams, Mahoney and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

Commissioner Mahoney moved that the Board adjourn to 5:00 o'clock p.m., Monday, September 24, 2007.

Second by Williams. All the Commissioners present voted aye and the motion was declared carried.
